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Neighborhood Development Update

AMLI, the company who built and manages the existing apartment complexes along Dry Creek and Logan conducted its' first official public meeting on August 9, 2022 concerning future development. Because of decisions made by the City a couple of years ago, AMLI purchased and re-zoned the land west of their existing rental units to allow multi family housing. As such, AMLI plans to build two up to 5-story apartments, starting with the north building located north of Village Drive. The complex will include first floor retail spaces along Village Drive. The final plans will be submitted to the City this winter. Development of the southern parcel is on hold and AMLI indicated they may develop that property in the future or look for a commercial developer that would develop it as retail space. Hinsdale Road Update

Essentially the work involves excavating to a depth of 3 feet under the roadway, curb, and south sidewalk. Then the roadway section will be built back up with two layers of geotextile material, granular subbase, and then curb/sidewalk/asphalt. We anticipate receiving construction bids in October, and then will work with the awarded contract on timeline. When the work would take place is still yet to be determined. Based on the projects we have bid this year, it has typically been 3 months from the time the project is awarded to construction actually starting. This is due to the volume of work contractors currently have in their queue and labor/material shortages. It's possible construction would be delayed until spring. But again, time will tell. There are so many unknowns in the market right now.
